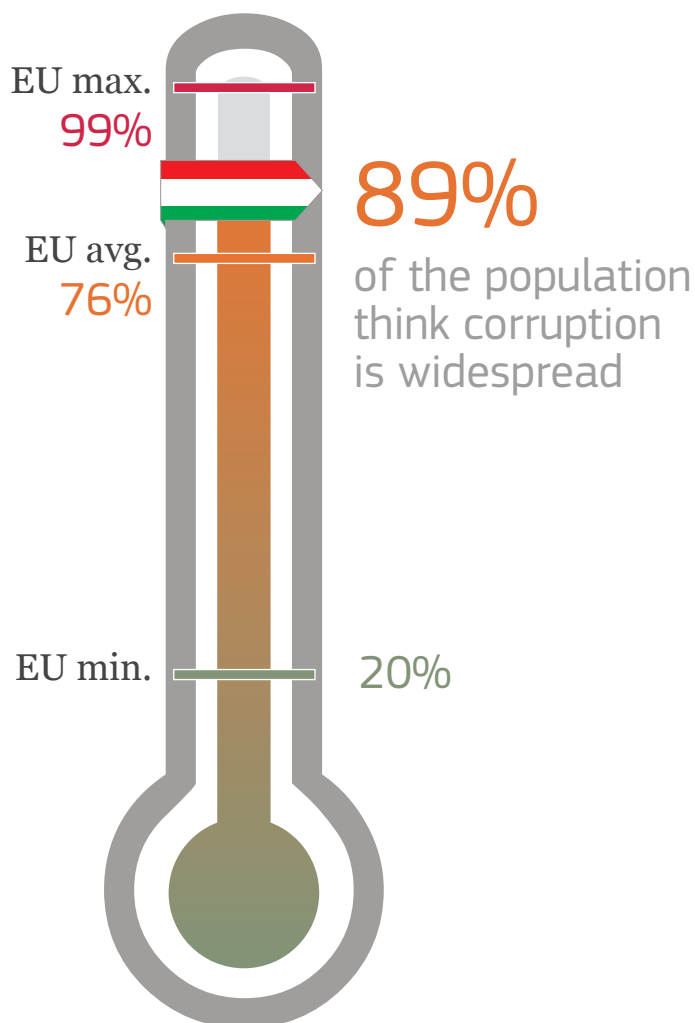
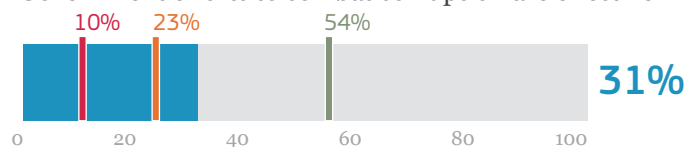


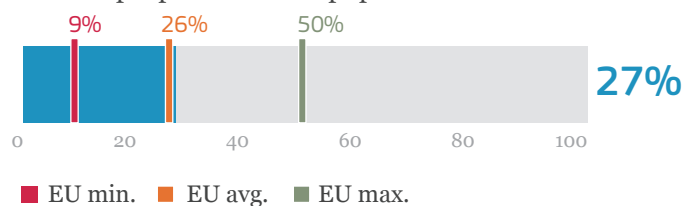

Government and utilities expenditure on works, goods and services (2010 estimate re-used for 2011)

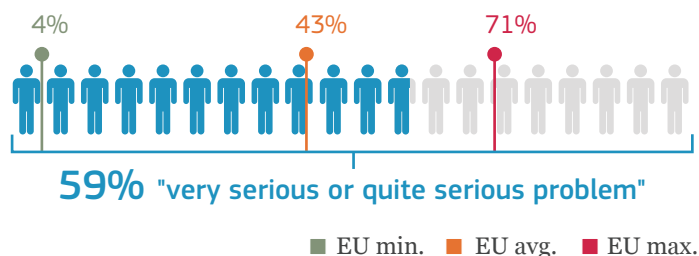

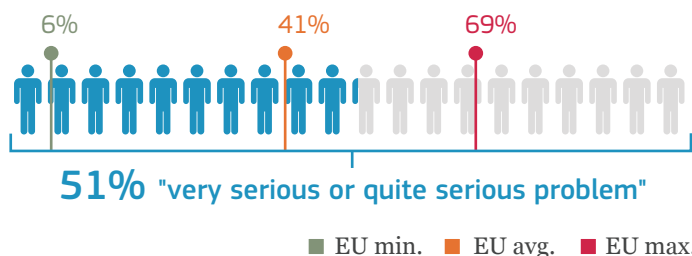

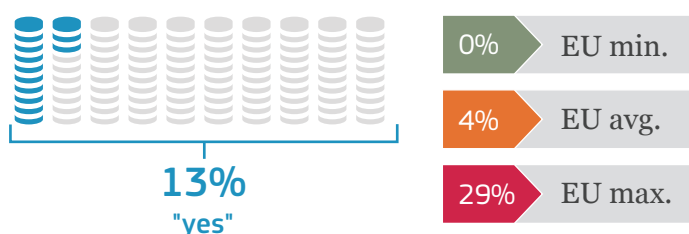
Do you consider corruption to be a problem or not for your company when doing business in Hungary?



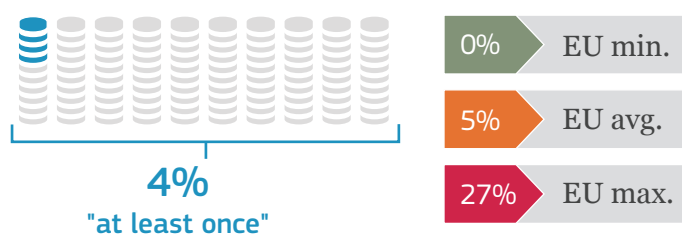
Do you consider patronage and nepotism to be a problem for your company when doing business in Hungary?



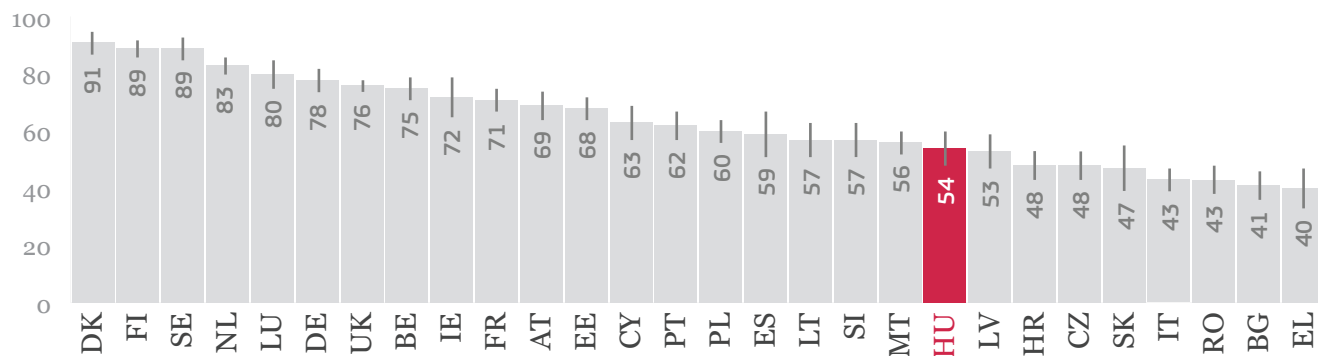
Over the last 12 months, has anyone asked you, or expected you, to pay a bribe for his or her services?



Has anyone in Hungary asked or expected someone from your company to pay a bribe?

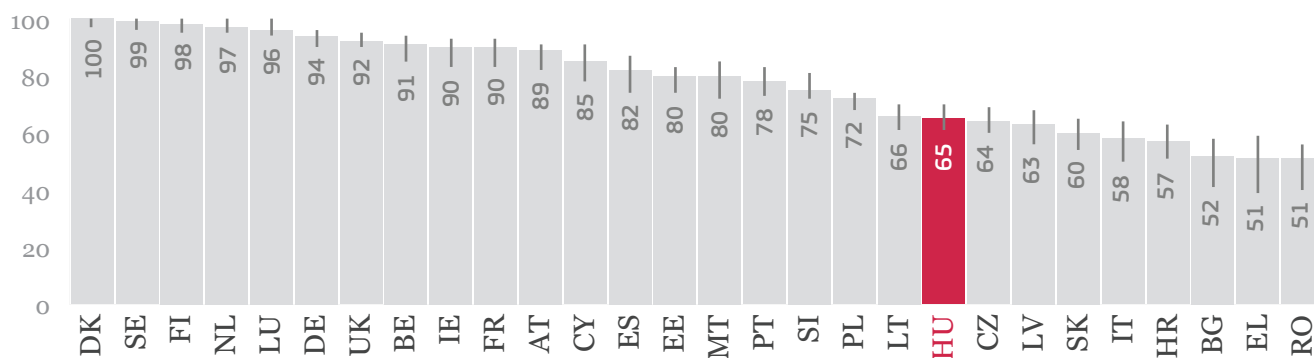


## Transparency International Corruption Perception Index (2013)



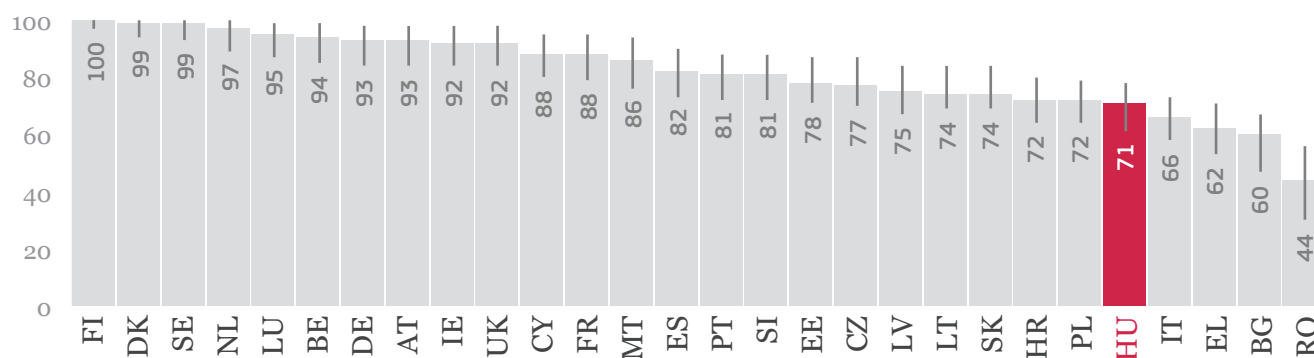

## Control of Corruption (percentile rank)



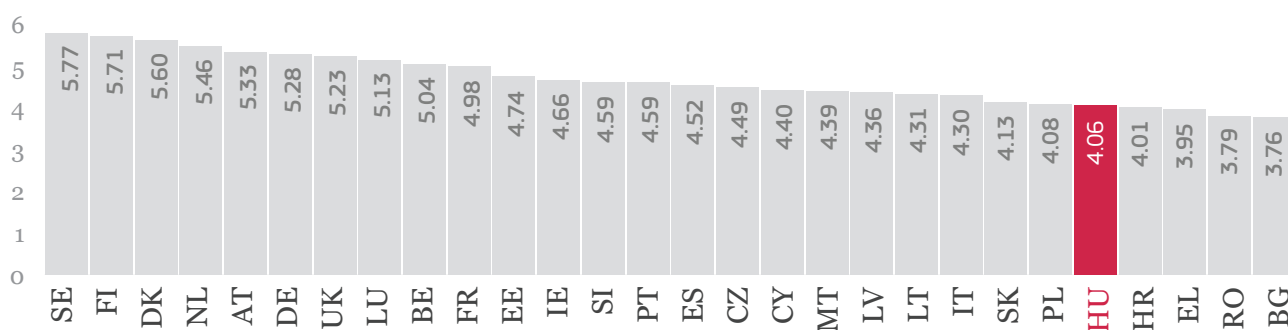

## Government Effectiveness (percentile rank)



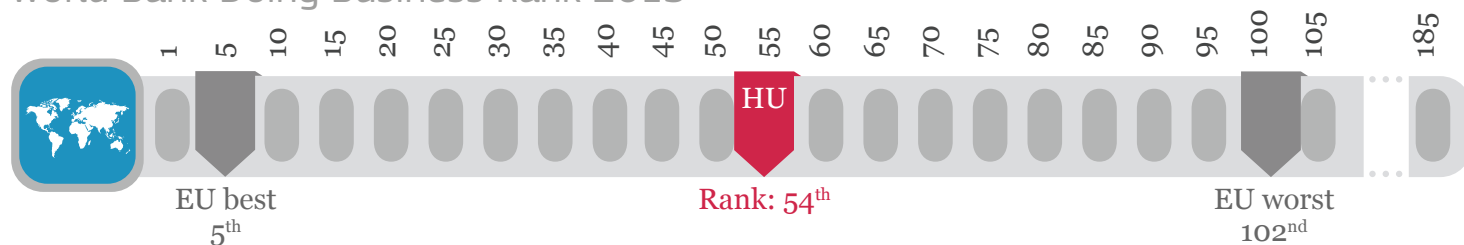
