SUBJECT: Notifications pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1805 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 14 November 2018 on the mutual recognition of freezing orders and confiscation orders

Within the meaning of Article 24 of Regulation (EU) 2018/1805 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 14 November 2018 on the mutual recognition of freezing orders and confiscation orders, I wish to inform you of the following:

Under Croatian national law, the competent authorities pursuant to the Regulation are:

- **for receiving freezing orders and confiscation orders, the county public prosecutor's offices according to the place where the property or objects are located or where the natural person has his or her domicile or residence, or where the legal person has its registered office;**
- **for issuing freezing orders, the public prosecutor's office and the court conducting the proceedings;**
- **for issuing confiscation orders, the competent court.**

In Croatia there are 15 county public prosecutor's offices and 25 municipal public prosecutor's offices, and 15 county courts and 30 municipal courts which have jurisdiction over criminal cases. Their contact details are provided in Annexes I and II.
