**Implementation of Council Framework Decision 2006/783/JHA on the application of the principle of mutual recognition to confiscation orders – information pursuant to Article 3 and declarations pursuant to Articles 7(5) and 19(2)**

In accordance with Article 22(2) of Council Framework Decision 2006/783/JHA of 6 October 2006 on the application of the principle of mutual recognition to confiscation orders, I enclose the text of the provisions transposing into Swedish law the obligations resulting from the Framework Decision.

Sweden also submits the following information pursuant to Article 3 of the Framework Decision. The Swedish Enforcement Authority is the competent authority under the Framework Decision, where Sweden is the issuing or executing State. In accordance with Article 7(5) of the Framework Decision, Sweden declares that it will not recognise and execute confiscation orders under the extended powers of confiscation referred to in Article 2(d)(iv) of the Framework Decision.

Pursuant to Article 19(2) of the Framework Decision, Sweden also declares that the certificate accompanying a confiscation order to be sent to Sweden for recognition and execution must be written in Swedish, Danish, Norwegian or English or be accompanied by a translation into one of those languages.
