



### Council of Europe HELP Programme CATALOGUE OF ONLINE COURSES

HELP is the **main educational Programme of the Council of Europe for legal professionals**. Its aim is to train judges, prosecutors and lawyers, but also other professionals, where relevant, on European human rights standards.

The Council of Europe **HELP online courses** are interactive and visual. They cover various human rights related topics, reflecting the different areas of work of the Council of Europe.

The **HELP courses** enhance the knowledge of legal professionals on key human rights topics and thus contribute to a better protection of human rights on a national level.

As well as the **European Convention on Human Rights** (ECHR) and the case-law of the **European Court of Human Rights**, HELP covers other **Council of Europe instruments** such as the European Social Charter or CoE Conventions in key areas like data protection, violence against women or bioethics. Furthermore, with EU support since 2015, HELP online courses also cover the **EU legal framework**, including the **EU Charter of Fundamental Rights** and the case-law of the **Court of Justice of the EU<sup>1</sup>**. Once HELP courses are ready, national versions can be developed complementing the European legal systems and jurisprudence with the national ones. These national courses help primarily judges, prosecutors and lawyers to apply European standards at national level in a practical way.

When contextualised to the national legislation and challenges, HELP courses also address the **training needs identified** by various **Council of Europe monitoring mechanisms** and support the **implementation of ECtHR judgments** pending execution. The HELP courses (especially those marked with the yellow label in the present catalogue ) also contribute to achieving the objectives set in the <u>EU Judicial Training strategy</u>.

HELP courses are developed in line with the HELP Methodology: jointly with the respective content entities of the Council of Europe. For example, the course on <u>Data Protection and</u> <u>Privacy Rights</u> or the one on <u>Key human rights principles in Biomedicine</u> were developed jointly with the CoE Data Protection and Bioethics Units respectively, the course on <u>Human Rights in Sports</u> was developed jointly with the CoE Sports Department, the course on <u>CPT standards</u> with the Committee on the Prevention of Torture, the one on

anti-discrimination with ECRI, etc. Lawyers from the Registry of the European Court of Human Rights (ECtHR) are also involved in the development of HELP online courses. Increasingly, key partners of HELP such as the European Judicial Training Network (EJTN), the Council of Bars and Law Societies of Europe (CCBE) and the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) are also offering their expertise in the development of HELP courses. The FRA – ECtHR joint handbooks are also used as key sources in the respective

thematic HELP courses.

The courses can be taken in the following ways:

#### **SELF-STUDY COURSES**

Available publicly for unlimited access to anyone having an account on the HELP online platform. They are self-paced courses and once completed, you can obtain an individualised digital **"Statement of accomplishment**".

how to enrol in HELP self-study courses

To enrol in any of the HELP courses for self-study, go to the CoE HELP e-learning platform, log-in with your HELP account, browse the list of courses and click on the

language code under the picture of your selected course. You can also click on the course titles in the catalogue to go the course of your choice, then click on the language code in which you wish to follow the course and enrol in the respective page.

Once enrolled, you can start and access the course [and resume where you left it last time] any time you want from the '**My courses**' button.

The approximate **duration** indicated per course is estimated on the English version of the course and its SCORMs<sup>4</sup>, and will appear on the digital self-generated 'statement of accomplishment' once the user completes the course. It must be noted that complementary information added to national versions of the courses (outside the SCORMs) may add e-learning time to the user.

#### **TUTORED COURSES**

The HELP tutored courses are organised in cooperation with a national partner institution, usually national training institutions for judges and prosecutors (JTIs) or Bar Associations (BAs). These tutored courses are facilitated/moderated by a HELP certified tutor, who was trained by the HELP Secretariat. Successful participants in HELP tutored courses are certified jointly by the HELP Programme and the national partner institution. If you are a legal professional and you would like to take a tutored course, contact the NTI or BA in your country, through the HELP Focal and Info Points.

Although the primary target group of the CoE HELP courses are legal professionals (judges, prosecutors and lawyers), some **interdisciplinary courses** may involve other professionals (health and medical specialists, prison and probation staff, law enforcement, journalists, Ombudsperson staff, NGOs, etc.).

#### HOW TO USE THE CATALOGUE

**Click on the course titles to access them** on the CoE HELP e-learning platform and see the **languages in which they are available** in self-learning format.

If you wish to have further information about the courses before accessing them, you can click on the Brief. Some courses have short presentation videos that you can also watch by clicking on Video.
